1 Summer schools shall be organized and operated as part of the public school program, shall be under the control  
2 and management of the Board, and shall comply with rules and regulations of the State Board of Education.<sup>1</sup>

3  
4 The summer school program, subject to annual approval by the Board, shall provide opportunities for review and  
5 limited regular courses at the middle and high school levels, and special programs funded by the state and/or  
6 federal grants. The content of summer courses may be offered on-line.

7  
8 Students may take courses in summer school **only** for the following reasons:

- 9  
10 1. The student failed the course during the regular school term.  
11 2. The student's grade in a course was not high enough to meet prerequisite requirements for a desired  
12 new course.  
13 3. Students transferring to the Wilson County Schools from another system shall be permitted to enroll in  
14 summer school if they are behind grade level in credits earned.

15  
16 No more than two (2) units shall be earned during any summer school session unless approved by the school  
17 principal.

18  
19 The library, laboratories, and other facilities shall be made available to all students enrolled in the summer school  
20 program.

21  
22 The Board shall annually determine the tuition rates.<sup>2</sup>

23  
24 Three (3) unexcused absences in any course offered during summer school renders a student ineligible to  
25 receive credit in that course.

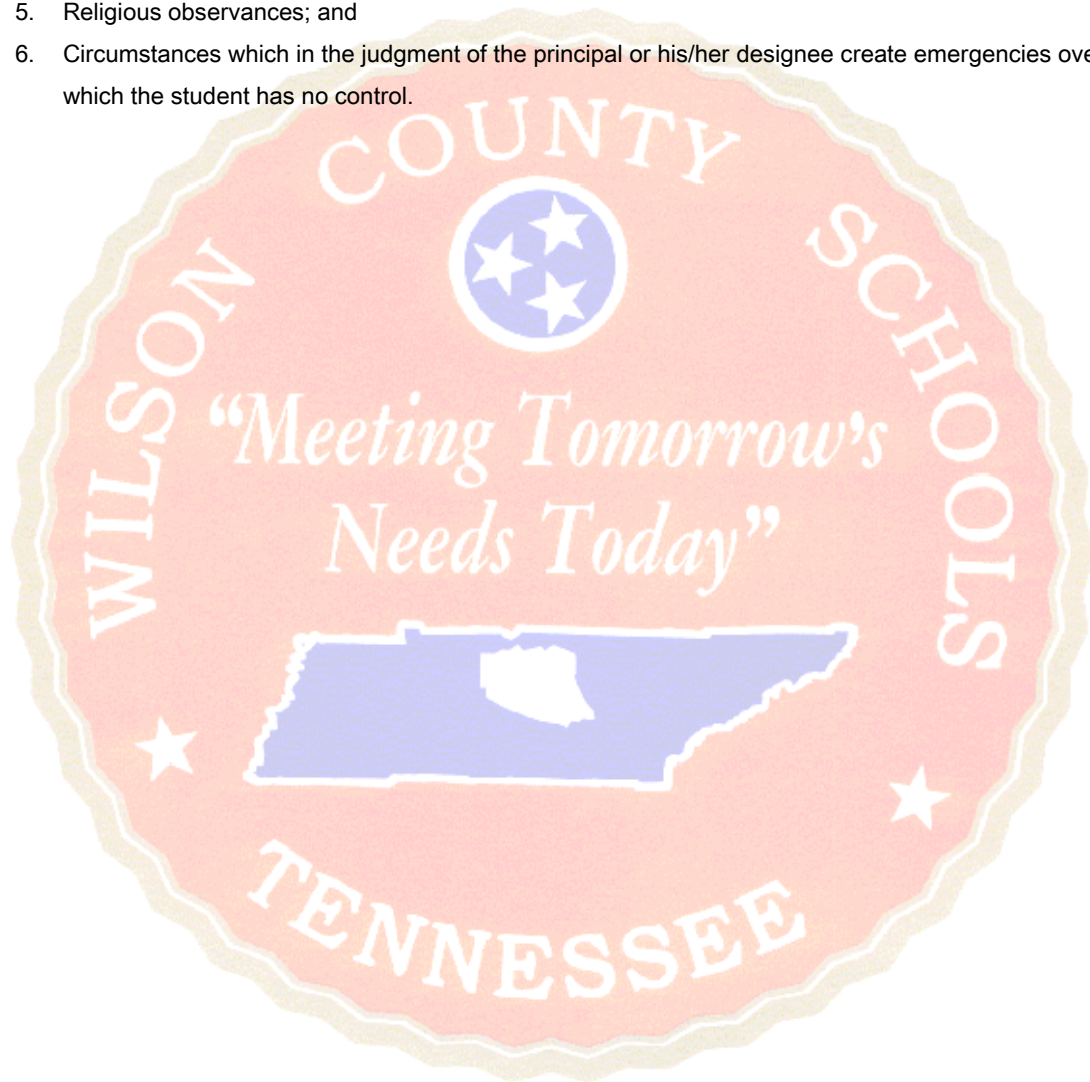

1 Absences shall be classified as either excused or unexcused as determined by the principal or his/her designee.

2 Excused absences shall include:

- 3
- 4 1. Personal illness;
- 5 2. Illness of an immediate family member;
- 6 3. Death in the family;
- 7 4. Extreme weather conditions;
- 8 5. Religious observances; and
- 9 6. Circumstances which in the judgment of the principal or his/her designee create emergencies over
- 10 which the student has no control.
