Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. Wilson County School Nutrition offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.00; lunch costs \$1.50. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch.

Return the completed application to: Your school cafeteria or mail to: School Nutrition Office, 351 Stumpy Lane, Lebanon, TN 37090, 615-453-7333.

Here are answers to questions you may have about applying:

- 1. Do I need to fill out an application for each child?** No. Complete the application to apply for free or reduced price meals. Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information.
- 2. Who can get free meals?** Children in households getting Food Stamps or Families First and most foster children can get free meals regardless of your income. If your students were receiving TANF (Families First) or Food Stamps in May 2008 they do not need to return this application; they are automatically eligible for free meals. **If you do not wish your eligible student(s) to receive free meals, please call Janice Stone at 615-453-7333.** Also, your children can get free price meals if your household income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Guidelines.
- 3. Can homeless, runaway and migrant children get free meals?** Please call Janice Stone at 615-453-7333 to see if your child(ren) qualify, if you have not been informed that they will get free meals.
- 4. Who can get reduced price meals?** Your children can get low cost meals if your household income is within the reduced price limits on the Federal Income Chart, shown on the application.
- 5. Should I fill out an application if I got a letter this school year saying my children are approved for free or reduced price meals?** Please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. Call the school at 615-453-7333.
- 6. I get WIC. Can my child(ren) get free meals?** Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please fill out an application.
- 7. Will the information I give be checked?** Yes, we may ask you to send written proof.
- 8. If I don't qualify now, may I apply later?** Yes. You may apply at any time during the school year if your household size goes up, income goes down, or if you start getting Food Stamps, FAMILIES FIRST or other benefits. If you lose your job, your children may be able to get free or reduced price meals.
- 9. What if I disagree with the school's decision about my application?** You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: Director of Wilson County Schools 351 Stumpy Lane Lebanon, TN 37090, 615-444-3282.
- 10. May I apply if someone in my household is not a U.S. citizen?** Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be a U.S. citizen to qualify for free or reduced price meals.
- 11. Who should I include as members of my household?** You must include all people living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives, or friends). You must include yourself and all children who live with you.
- 12. What if my income is not always the same?** List the amount that you normally get. For example, if you normally get \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only got \$900, put down that you get \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but not if you get it only sometimes.
- 13. We are in the military, do we include our housing allowance as income?** If your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. All other allowances must be included in your gross income.

DEAR PARENT OR GUARDIAN:

Meals are served every school day. Students may buy lunch for \$1.50 in elementary school or \$1.50 in middle/high school, and/or breakfast for \$1.00 in elementary schools. Eligible students may receive meals free or at a reduced price of \$0.40 for lunch and/or \$0.30 for breakfast for elementary schools. You or your child(ren) do not have to be a U.S. citizen to qualify for free or reduced price meals.

HOW TO FILL OUT THIS APPLICATION - PLEASE PRINT NEATLY WITH BLACK INK. PLEASE USE CAPITAL LETTERS. COMPLETE ONE APPLICATION PER HOUSEHOLD AND ONE FOR EACH FOSTER CHILD.

PART 1 - IF YOU ARE APPLYING FOR A FOSTER CHILD, YOU MUST COMPLETE A SEPARATE APPLICATION FOR EACH FOSTER CHILD. Put an X in the box provided if this application is for a Foster Child. Enter the Foster child's monthly PERSONAL USE income in the boxes provided. Foster children may be eligible for free or reduced price meals regardless of the income of the households with whom they reside.

PART 2 - If you believe the child for whom you are applying is homeless, migrant, or a runaway, contact your school homeless liaison or migrant coordinator at (615) 453-7333, and place an X in the appropriate box.

PART 3 - Enter the enrolled [Student's ID/SSN] (optional), first name, middle initial, last name, date of birth, grade, school code, Food Stamp or TANF number and income, if each child listed on the application has a Food Stamp or TANF number, you may skip Parts 4 & 5. You MUST fill out Parts 4 & 5 if one or more students listed DOES NOT have a case number. If this is a foster child application, ONLY list the foster child - DO NOT list any other students.

PART 4 - Enter the names of ALL OTHER people living in your household who are not listed above. Household means a group of related or non-related individuals, who are not residents of an institution or boarding house, but who are living as one economic unit. DO NOT include the names of the students listed in Part 3 and DO NOT include any foster children. If the individual has no income, put an X in the box indicating No Income next to the individual's name. Enter the income BEFORE DEDUCTIONS in the appropriate column, and indicate the frequency at which the income is received. Next to the amount, bubble in HOW OFTEN the person got paid.

INCOMPLETE, UNREADABLE, OR INCORRECT APPLICATIONS WILL DELAY MEAL BENEFITS.

NOTICE: if you currently receive Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), Food Stamps, or TANF, your enrolled child(ren) may be eligible for free meals.

MEDICAL OR SPECIAL DIETARY NEEDS: If you believe your child needs a food substitute or texture modification because of a disability, please contact the school. A child with a disability is entitled to a special meal at no extra charge if the disability prevents the child from eating the regular school meals.

APPLY FOR BENEFITS: You may apply for benefits at any time during the school year. If you are not eligible now but your income lessens, you lose your job, your household size becomes larger, or you become eligible for Food Stamps or TANF benefits, you may complete another application at that time.

REPORTING INCOME: If your income is not always the same, list the amount that you normally get. For example, if you normally get \$1,000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only got \$800, enter that you receive \$1,000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but not if you get it only sometimes.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER: This application must have the Social Security Number of the adult who signs the application, or the box indicating that the adult does not have a Social Security Number must be checked. If a Food Stamp or TANF case number for the child is listed, or if the application is for a foster child, a Social Security Number is not needed.

VERIFICATION: Your eligibility may be checked at any time during the school year. School officials may ask you to send records proving that your child should receive free or reduced price meals.

PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT: The Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act requires the information on this application. You do not have to give the information, but if you do not, we cannot approve your child for free or reduced price meals. You must include the social security number of the adult household member who signs the application. The social security number is not required when you apply on behalf of a foster child or you list a Food Stamp Program, Families First Program or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) case number or other FDPIR identifier for your child or when you indicate that the adult household member signing the application does not have a social security number. We will use your information to determine if your child is eligible for free or reduced price meals, and for administration and enforcement of the lunch and breakfast programs. We MAY share your eligibility information with education, health, and nutrition programs to help them evaluate, fund, or determine benefits for their programs, auditors for program reviews, and law enforcement officials to help them look into violations of program rules.

Student At-Risk Factors Questionnaire

Wilson County Schools Pre-Kindergarten program targets at-risk 4-year olds, with first priority given to children who qualify for the free/reduced meal program. Students must turn 4 by September 30.

Once all children eligible for free/reduced meals are identified and enrolled, other risk factors may be considered for enrollment. Previous state statute identifies other at-risk factors such as ELL (English Language Learners), special needs, abuse, neglect and state custody. Children who have a parent deployed to active military duty are also considered eligible for enrollment.

Other at-risk factors considered may include low scores on a screening instrument (Brigance), being raised by a grandparent or other family members other than the parents, family displacement by a natural disaster, severe unexpected financial crisis, or homeless.

This information will be kept in strict confidence. We hope to identify all at-risk children and provide an opportunity to develop school readiness, foster the love and joy of learning and promote success throughout the child's life.

The Wilson County Schools Pre-Kindergarten Program targets at-risk 4-year olds, with first priority given to children who qualify for the free/reduced meal program. The following information will help answer your questions about the program. Qualifying for the Pre-K Program:

How does my child qualify for the Pre-K program?

- ☺ **ALL** children in the Pre-K Program **must** turn 4 by September 30th
- 1st Priority for enrollment :**
 - ☺ The family is income eligible for free/reduced meals
- 2nd Priority for enrollment:**
 - ☺ The child has an IEP (Individual Education Plan)
 - ☺ The child is in state or foster care
 - ☺ The child is an English Language Learner (ELL)
 - ☺ The parent is deployed in active military duty
- If spaces are still available, we may enroll children based on the Community Pre-K Advisory Council priority for enrollment:**
 - ☺ Pre-mature birth (4 weeks or more)
 - ☺ Low developmental screening (AGS, Fluharty, Brigance)
 - ☺ Teenage mother / father
 - ☺ Child being raised by Grandparent or other family member (not biological parent)
 - ☺ TEIS services; Ø qualify for Special education services
 - ☺ WIC; SSI; Families First; Even Start services
 - ☺ Prior Head Start services

What happens after registration?

The free/reduced meal application will be reviewed by the Wilson County Schools nutrition staff to determine eligibility. The Pre-K Coordinator will review the At-Risk questionnaires to take into consideration any other eligibility factors.

When will I find out if my child is eligible for the Pre-K program?

You will receive a postcard letting you know whether or not your child meets the eligibility criteria for priority placement in the Pre-K program. April 2nd applicants will receive notification by mid May 2009.

What if my child does not qualify?

Your child's name will be placed on a waiting list. Any additional spaces will be filled on a first come-first serve basis (based on the received application date). Children in this category will be notified by the start of the school year to see if you are still interested in the Pre-K program if additional spaces are available.

What happens next if my child is accepted in the Pre-K program?

You will receive a phone call from a Head Start Family Service Coordinator or Pre-K Program Assistant. We will set-up a time to meet with you and your child to complete the paperwork for the Pre-K program. You will need your child's birth certificate, social security card, complete immunizations and physical before school starts.

What does Head Start have to do with the Pre-K program?

Wilson County Schools and Head Start work together to provide educational, medical, dental, and family services for all students enrolled in the Pre-K program. This partnership helps families establish a confident link between school and home.

Where would my child attend Pre-K if a class is not located in our zoned school?	Eligible students zoned to a school that has a Pre-K class get 1 st priority for that school. If space is available at a class near you, your child will be able to attend that Pre-K class even though it is not your zoned school. Pre-K is voluntary and parents provide transportation.
Is there a charge for my child to attend the Pre-K program?	There is not a charge for children to attend the Pre-K program. If you do not qualify for free or reduced meals, you will be asked to pay for breakfast and lunch provided by the school cafeteria.
What are the Pre-K class hours?	Pre-K students go to school 5½ hours each school day. Typically, Pre-K students start school 15 minutes after all other students begin and end 1 hour before all other students dismiss.
Do Pre-K students come to school every day?	Yes. Daily attendance is critical for your child in order to be ready for Kindergarten. When a child is absent, please send a doctors excuse or parent note to school the next day. Students that miss consistently may be asked to give up their spot in the class to another eligible child.
Is bus transportation available for Pre-K students?	No. Transportation is provided by the parents or guardians.
Is before and after daycare available for Pre-K students at the school?	No. We do not provide any before or after daycare for our students.
What do Pre-K students wear to school?	Pre-K students follow the standard dress code adopted by the Wilson County Board of Education. A copy of the dress code is available online @ www.wcschools.com
Is breakfast and lunch available for Pre-K students?	Yes. All children in the Pre-K program are expected to eat the meals provided at school. Children in the Pre-K program are served a nutritious breakfast, lunch, and snack daily. Many children are very "picky" eaters. Our school nutrition staff provides a variety of choices for your child. The Pre-K students eat "family style" in their classroom. Meals are a teaching and learning time. We encourage children to try new foods and expand their tastes. We ask that you do not send packed lunches or outside food for your child.
What do children do in the Pre-K program?	When you walk into our high-quality Pre-K classrooms, you will see children involved in active, hands-on learning that engages each child and fosters a love of learning. Activities are designed to enhance a child's natural curiosity and desire to learn through participation in both large and small group activities. Play is essential to the development of strong learners.
