Since 2006 we've awarded 72 scholarship awards to students in six countries.

For this year's scholarship competition we are offering 12 individual scholarships, each worth \$750 (USD). Several smaller awards will also be issued. To be eligible for the scholarship you must either be enrolled in college (minimum of 3 hours / one class), or have been accepted for admission to a university and will begin classes during the spring semester of the 2010 academic year. High school seniors who are enrolled in dual credit courses are also eligible to apply.

  - Students must have at least a 2.0 GPA.
  - Scholarships are only awarded to those students who are in financial need. Applicants must, therefore, provide complete Financial Aid information on the scholarship form and have the form signed by his/her Financial Aid Officer.

    - The A. Patrick Charnon Scholarship provides \$1,500 per academic year, prorated and awarded at the beginning of each academic term (for example, semester or quarter). Recipients may re-apply each year for up to four years, provided they continue to meet the requirements of the award.

Recipients must be admitted or enrolled in a full-time undergraduate program of study in an accredited four-year college or university in the United States. They must maintain good academic standing and make progress toward a degree. The Charnon Scholarship Review Committee will decide whether applicants fulfill the requirements of the award. The selection committee looks for candidates who value tolerance, compassion and respect for all people in their communities, and who have demonstrated their commitments to these values by their actions.

In addition to the application form, you need to submit a 2-4 page essay (typed, double-spaced) explaining how community service experiences have shaped your life and how you will use your college educations to build communities in a manner consistent with Pat Charnon's values of compassion, tolerance, generosity and respect. We also require an official transcript from your high school or college and three letters of reference addressed to the Charnon Scholarship Selection Committee.

Applications must be postmarked by March 31st for the academic year beginning in August or September. Recipients will be notified of their award in early August, and a profile of the recipient will be posted on The Center website.

The applicant who, in the judgment of the selection committee, best reflects the values of Pat Charnon will receive the award.

- The Society for Technical Communication is a professional organization for people developing technical information through such occupations as technical writing, editing, graphical design, interface design, and web design. The goal of the Society is to improve the transfer of information about science and technology from its developer (e.g., scientist, engineer, inventor) to its user or exploiter. These scholarships are for students working toward this goal.

Four awards of \$1,500 each will be granted toward school tuition and expenses. Two awards are granted to graduate students, and two to undergraduates.

Eligibility requirements are as follows:

- \* Applicants must have completed at least one year of post-secondary education.
- \* Applicants must be full-time students. They may be either graduate students working toward a Master's or Doctor's degree, or undergraduate students working toward a Bachelor's degree.
- \* Students should have at least one full year of academic work remaining to complete their degree programs, although under exceptional circumstances an award may be granted to a student for the final half-year.
