Study: Sleep central to learning, memory

A single night's sleep helped people learn complex tasks and remember information they thought they had forgotten, according to a study. "Sleep consolidated learning by restoring what was lost over the

course of a day following training and by protecting what was learned against subsequent loss," said researcher Howard Nusbaum, a University of Chicago psychology professor. "These findings suggest that sleep

has an important role in learning generalized skills in stabilizing and protecting memory." ScienceDaily (11/19)
