Graduation Requirements

Twenty-eight (28) credits are required to graduate: English, 4 credits; Math, 3 credits; Science, 3 credits; Lifetime Wellness, 1 credit; Geography, 1 credit; Fine Art, 1 credit; Foreign Language, 2 credits in same language; Electives, 7-11 credits dependent on path choice.

Marking System & Related Procedures

Numerical grades are given in all classes for each grading period. The following grading scale is used in all classes: A=93-100; B=85-92; C=75-84; D=70-74; F=69 and below. Class rank is calculated by and includes all subjects given school credit beginning with the first semester of the 9th grade through the first semester of the 12th grade (seven semesters). GPA is weighted beginning in the 2003-04 school year and is on a 5.0 scale. The school follows the block scheduling system with 1 credit earned per course per term.

Curriculum

Wilson Central High School offers Advanced Placement courses in English literature and composition, junior English, and Sophomore World Studies, Calculus, Psychology, Biology, U.S. History, Macro-Economics, U.S. Government & Politics, German 4, and Spanish 4. Honors courses are offered in English 1, 2, 3, 4; Algebra 2, Geometry; World Geography, and Biology. Dual Enrollment courses (college) are also offered.
