# FAQs

## What is a Strategic Plan?

Strategic plans are what many of you may remember as a School Improvement Plan. These are completed at both the district and school level. A strategic plan should provide an academic focus for the school year based upon the current status of the school/district in relation to the expectations and goals set forth per the Tennessee State Department of Education.

## Who approves a Strategic Plan?

The Tennessee Department of Education approves the district's Strategic Plan.



# Prioritized Goals

## Goal #1

### Increased Academic Achievement: Reading Language Arts

(1) The district will achieve a level 3 TVAAS score or higher in literacy.

(2) The district will maintain or improve the percentile rank in terms of the number of students scoring on-track (proficient) and mastered (advanced) relative to other districts in the state in Reading / Language Arts.

(3) The district will maintain or improve the percentile rank in terms of the number of students scoring on-track (proficient) and mastered (advanced) in the four subgroups as identified per the Tennessee Department of Education.



# Prioritized Goals

## Goal #2

### Increased Academic Achievement: Mathematics

(1) The district will achieve a level 3 TVAAS score or higher in mathematics.

(2) The district will maintain or improve the percentile rank in terms of the number of students scoring on-track (proficient) and mastered (advanced) relative to other districts in the state in mathematics.

(3) The district will maintain or improve the percentile rank in terms of the number of students scoring on-track (proficient) and mastered (advanced) in the four subgroups as identified per the Tennessee Department of Education.



# Prioritized Goals

## Goal #3

### College and Career Ready Students

- (1) The district will maintain a graduation rate of at least 95%.
- (2) The district will increase the percentage of students scoring at or above 21 on the ACT by .5%.
- (3) The district will increase the average composite ACT score by 0.2 points to a 21.

### Safe and Healthy Students

Students will have equal access to a safe learning environment that promotes academic achievement, limits the amount of lost instructional time, and ensures that all students have the opportunity to learn.

Students entering kindergarten will have the cognitive skills, language and literacy skills, social, emotional, and the physical skills necessary to effectively transition to kindergarten and meet early literacy milestones.
