COMMUNITY AND SCHOOL

The city of Mount Juliet is located approximately ten miles east of Nashville with a population of ~31,000. Mt. Juliet High School, CEEB/ACT code 431600, is an accredited four year high school in the Wilson County School System. The average enrollment is approximately 1450. The school follows a 4 by 4 block schedule with one credit earned per course; students have potential to earn 8 credits per year. The certified staff at Mt. Juliet High School is composed of 5 administrators, four school counselors, 1 STARS counselor, one Media Specialist, one graduation coach, and 95 teachers including 7 special education teachers. Additional staff members include two school resource officers and 22 classified employees.

Mt. Juliet High School is proud to offer over 25 different sports, more than 60 clubs, and many other extracurricular activities and community service activities. Participation enriches each student's educational experience and strengthens our school community. Opportunities include Student Government, honor societies, academic clubs, Yearbook, Unplugged Gamers, Gay/Straight Alliance and much more.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Twenty-six (26) credits are required for graduation. Course requirements include:

- English (4 credits)
- Math (4 credits)
- Science (3 credits)
- Social Studies (3 credits)
- Fine Arts (1 credit)
- Lifetime Wellness (1 credit)
- Physical Education (1/2 credit)
- Foreign Language (2 credits)
- Personal Finance (1/2 credit)
- Elective Focus* (3 credits)
- 4 Additional Elective credits

*Elective Focus- a focused plan of study comprised of three credits. These credits must be earned in one of the following programs of study: Math/Science, Humanities/Fine Arts, Career and Technical Education (CTE), JROTC, Advanced Placement.

MARKING SYSTEM AND RELATED PROCEDURES

Letter grades are given in all classes for each grading period. The following grading scale is used:

A: 93-100 B: 85-92 C: 75-84 D: 70-74 F: 69 and below

Students will no longer be ranked but will be able to graduate with the Latin Honors Designation based on Grade Point Average: Summa Cum Laude – 4.25 and above, Magna Cum Laude – 4.0-4.24, and Cum Laude – 3. GPA is calculated by and includes all subjects given school credit beginning with the first semester of the 9th grade and ending with the final semester of the 12th grade (8 semesters). It is based on a 4.0 scale and is weighted by the following criteria: 0.5 for Dual Enrollment and Honors Courses, 1.0 for AP Courses.

HONORS COURSES

MJHS offers Honors level courses in almost all subject areas and disciplines.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Mount Juliet High School has partnered with Vol State Community College, Middle Tennessee State University, and Cumberland University to offer courses for both high school and college credit.
